

### PRELUDE

"Pre" means before. The prelude is music played before the start of the service.



First steps takes place during the worship services. The children gather on the stairs and learn about God's love, through Bible passages, stories, or books.





Baptism is a "sacrament": something that seems ordinary but is very special. The pastors touch the forehead of the one being baptized with water and a blessing in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.



### **BENEDICTION**

A prayer (or blessing) usually said at the end of worship



### **ANTHEM**

A song of praise to God, which often contains words from the Bible.



### DOXOLOGY

A song that thanks and praises God



## **RESPONSIVE PRAYER**

A prayer the congregation (people in the pews) read aloud together.



This is a time when we can share things we are happy about, thankful for, or sad or worried about. Sharing our happiness makes it more joyful; sharing our sadness often helps lessen our burden, and allows others to



pray for us.



## POSTLUDE

"Post" means after. A postlude is a closing piece of music, played at the end of worship





Members of the congregation give money to support the ministry of the church. Musicians offer a gift of music while the plates are passed.





CALL TO WORSHIP

Words designed to help prepare our hearts for the worship of God.



Communion is a "sacrament": something that seems ordinary, but is very special. Christians share bread and the cup to remember Jesus. Everyone is welcome to receive communion at our church (including kids!).

## Child's Guide To Worship


Jesus said "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these"
