SPRING CLEANING

Western Springs "Household Clean-up Day" coming in June

According to the Western Springs website: The \$5 charge on your water bill - applied 6 times a year - helps offset costs for fall leaf collection and for household spring clean-up day: **Saturday**, **June 24**, **2023**. Residents of Western Springs can dispose of household items including clothing, draperies, books, furniture, scrap metal, and appliances. No registration is required for this service. All items for disposal must be on the curb by 7AM the morning of collection day.

Household garbage, landscape waste, electronics, liquids, tires, batteries, medical waste, and construction and demolition debris are NOT eligible.

Bob's TV and Metal Pick up Service (630) 235-0387: CRT TV's, computer monitors, flat screen TV's, plasma TV's, large appliances, copy machines, hot water tank, lawn mowers, tools, bicycles, and many more items. Call Bob to set up a FREE pickup time.

CELL PHONES ETC -

Brookfield Zoo, in partnership with Eco-Cell, accepts cell phones, smartphones, iPods, iPads and tablets at either entrance by the **North and South Gates**, or give to any zoo staff member.

Cell phones contain the mineral coltan. Mining of coltan in Congolese Africa endangers gorillas and their rain-forest habitat. Your phone will be recycled into a new one, saving the need for additional coltan mining.

Eco-Cell recommends that individuals donating cellphones discontinue service and factory reset their phones before turning them in for recycling.
